### **PRO-LIFE BOOTCAMP**

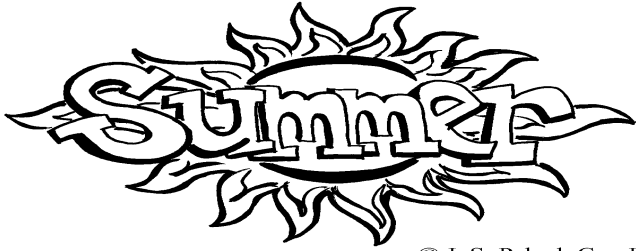

## THE SPIRIT IN A PHONE CALL

Writer and teacher, Ms. Sandstrom, shared this story with an acclaimed literary organization:

“The mother of a 3-yr-old son; trapped in an abusive relationship; an addict in horrible withdrawal—Auburn was curled up on a filthy carpet in a cluttered apartment. She had hit bottom. For hours she had been folding and unfolding a small bit of paper her mother had given her. It was the phone number of a Christian counselor. Finally the young mother punched in the number and heard the voice of a man on the other end of the line.

‘*Uh, do you think you could talk to me*’, she stuttered. Auburn heard some shuffling—a radio was snapped off in the background and the voice became very present. For the first time Auburn poured out her story. She told him that she wasn’t feeling good, that things had gotten pretty bad in her marriage, that she had a drug problem, that she was scared.

The man on the other end didn’t judge. Auburn was encouraged by his kindness. It was 2:00 in the morning—the man stayed up the whole night with Auburn, simply being present with her until the sun rose. By daybreak, she had calmed down and the raw panic had passed. Then she asked him if he wasn’t supposed to ‘*read a Bible verse or something*’. She told him that ‘*seriously, he was very good at what he did and asked how long he had been a Christian Counselor.*’ He laughed and said that he was glad that she thought he had been helpful.

Then he said, ‘Auburn, please don’t hang up—I have to tell you I am not a Christian counselor—you got the wrong number...’ Auburn didn’t hang up. They talked a bit longer. She never got his name or contacted him again. Auburn—Ms. Sandstrom—survived the night, raised her son alone, and became a successful writer and teacher.

She concludes her story:

‘...the next day I felt this kind of joy, like I was shining. I think I’ve heard it called *the peace that passes understanding*. I had gotten to see that there is this completely random love in the universe. That it is unconditional. And that some of it was for me...In the deepest, blackest night of despair, if you can get just one pinhole of light...all of grace rushes in.’”

Compassion and selfless caring; reconciliation and peace—these are the signs by which we recognize the Spirit of Jesus—the Spirit of transformation and grace which bind us to the love that *is* God; the love that now binds us to one another. This love knows no boundaries; this love gives voice to the things we believe but are unable to speak; this is the love that enables us to be for others “pinholes of light” through which the grace of God rushes in
