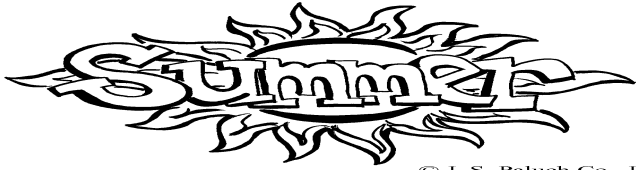
PROJECT RACHEL

MAY GOD CIRCLE ‘ROUND US’

It is the wedding of their daughter: a day of anxious anticipation—so many details— but, also a day of loveliness and joy.

During the reception the whole family is on the dance floor. It starts with their son, who served as an usher, dancing with his mom. The new bride is dancing with her father. Soon the four of them are dancing together, holding hands, clapping, laughing and crying. Before long they are joined by the newest member of their family—the new husband.

It is a moment of complete joy and love for a family that together conquered the many challenges of marriage and parenthood and growing up.

It is a picture of God—God with us; God for us—the God who joins hands with us; the dynamic Love that dances in every aspect of our lives. Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity—the God whose love draws us ever deeper into union with the essence of divine life which Jesus lived as community—one with us in the dance of life.

John of Damascus in the seventh century described God as *periocoresis*: taken from two Greek words meaning ‘all around’ (*peri*); and ‘dancing’ (*choresis*). John wrote: “*Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are like three dancers, holding hands, dancing together in perfect love, perfect freedom and perfect harmony. They are unified in one intimate, indissoluble substance, yet they are recognizable as community—in relationship, in shared purpose, and in mutual love. And so should we be united together.*”

One can almost imagine then, the perfect communion of the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, delighting in each other and in all of creation—exchanging unceasing beauty and delight—and continually inviting, and drawing all of us into the dance!

Thus, this Feast of the Holy Trinity calls us to embrace mystery—to delight in God’s love—a love that finds a way to dance around and through every barrier of the human heart— a love that transcends every condition and qualification we may set for ourselves and for others. The image of the Triune God enables us to recognize God’s love circling round us, intertwining and binding us together in a mutual harmony that knows no separation.

May we allow ourselves to join this dance of love —may we circle round one another in prayer, and rejoice and delight in one another as God delights in us
