DIOCESAN PASTORAL PLANNING PROCESS

Perhaps you remember the parish evaluation process which Bishop da Cunha instructed ALL parishes in the Diocese to participate in last year. Parishioners were given the opportunity to evaluate their parish in five different areas (Sacraments and Worship, Ministry and Service, Faith Formation, Community, and Finances and Administration). Evaluation teams were also formed in each parish to complete a more in-depth evaluation of these areas. All of this information, from each parish, was submitted to the Diocese.

Once all of the evaluation data was collected by the Diocese, all pastors were given a large binder, containing a very detailed compilation of the results for his parish. Due to the volume of information contained in the binder, simple communication of the results of the evaluation process would be impossible. However, the binder containing the results of our St. Joan of Arc Parish Evaluation is available in the Rectory for anyone who would like to review it.

Bishop da Cunha is still working hard on the Pastoral Planning Process. The Parish Evaluations are but one piece of the puzzle as we consider the future of the Diocese. More information will be forthcoming about this process in the near future.

WHEN DOES OUR HOPE DIE?

Palm Sunday begins the week which we call Holy Week. The palms are gathered from the 'kingly' palm trees of the region; and symbolize a victory of royal status. They are waved in abandon and spread before the donkey that carries Jesus into Jerusalem. But the crowd is fickle and easily swayed – by Friday they are jeering and shouting for his death. How quickly we move through the scenes of the week: the intimacy and sacred legacy of the Last Supper; the agony of waiting with Jesus in the Garden; the brutal night of interrogation; the torturous journey to Calvary – the destination of his death. How is one to cope with it all? Who wouldn't run away or try to deny any knowledge of this man, Jesus?

The question doesn't stop at Calvary. It echoes in our own time and place. We welcome the hope Jesus brings — his healing; his forgiveness; his love. So when is it that we, too, drop the palm branches and walk away? When does our hope die?

Is it when Jesus asks us to take up our own crosses? When he insists that we sell what we have and give to the poor? When he shows us the way of non-violence, non-judgment, and non-prejudice? Or is it when he calls us out of our safe little 'tombs' of self-righteousness to embrace even our enemies?

Do we walk away when the going gets tough, or try to distance ourselves from this Jesus who doesn't seem to be 'coming through' for us? Do we rationalize that Jesus is someone we can admire from a distance, but to get too close might prove much too costly?

It is precisely here in the midst of our blindness, our fearfulness, and our ignorance that Jesus comes into the world to be with us — in the very doubts and struggles that cause us to give up hope. In the outstretched arms of the crucified Jesus — we are visibly held (with all of our imperfections and struggles) in the unconditional embrace of love. This is the God who yearns for all creation to realize the original dream for a world of peace and justice — a world in which human hearts are transformed and reignited with the love of God.

As we welcome the Christ of Victory, may we be just as welcoming of the Christ of Suffering. As we embrace the Jesus of humility and selflessness, may we also clothe ourselves with compassion and be imitators of his limitless generosity and mercy. It is our daily discipleship that sustains our hope and gives homage to the One hailed as king on that first Palm Sunday.
