THE GOOD SHEPHERD IN FOOTBALL CLEATS

Selfless, giving, loyal, resilient are just a few adjectives used to describe Aaron Feis. Coach Feis had an all-encompassing presence that both athletes and non-athletes knew and loved well beyond the halls of Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School and the community of Parkland, Florida. No one was shocked or surprised to hear that Coach Feis ran toward gunfire to take a bullet for the students at his school when others might have run away. A school security guard and assistant football coach, 37-year-old Aaron Feis was one of the 17 killed in the Ash Wednesday shootings at Stoneman Douglas.

Coach Feis was more than a coach, especially to kids-at-risk. He made it his business to get to know college recruiters and spent countless hours on his own time making highlight DVD's for any player he thought might need an extra boost. Approximately 70 young athletes made it to college because of his backing.

Brower County Sheriff Scott Israel said of his friend, *"Before you even heard how he died, you knew he died putting his own safety aside to save others – that's just who he was! Head coaches have come and gone from Parkland, but what's the one constant? Big Feis. Kids would do more for 'big Feis' because they never wanted to let him down."* And Feis never let them down!

Christ, the Good Shepherd, walks among us still in the lives of people like Coach Feis, whose love and compassion enable them to 'lay down their lives' for the students, the patients, the soldiers, the mentally and physically challenged entrusted to their care. In Christ we belong to one another – in imitating Christ, our lives are lived in service to others.

In this most beloved image of Jesus as The Good Shepherd we do not speak so much of the role of "lowly sheep", as the image of the One who loves in an intimately personal and self-giving manner – even to the point of sacrificing his life. Big Feis and others like him become images of the Christ Love that knows the beloved by name and encourages them to grow and love as they are loved. On this Good Shepherd Sunday, may we give thanks for the courage and love of those who have laid down their lives for us and for others – and seek for ourselves the grace to follow their example by living our lives in compassionate and thoughtful service of one another.
