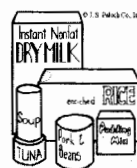
BE STILL

SVDP FOOD PACKING NEEDS YOU!

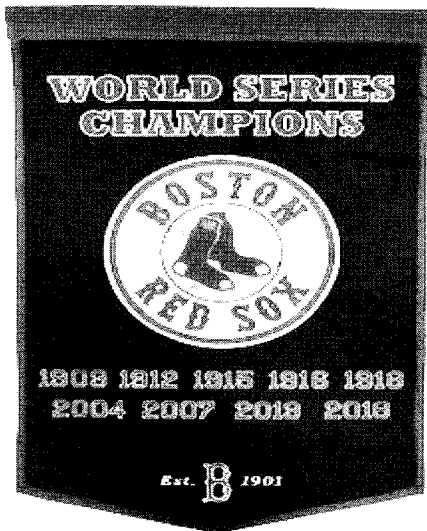

MOVIE UPDATE

As part of the Diocesan Safe Child Curriculum, Kindergarten through Grade 5 students viewed the Office of Safe Environment movies reminding them about personal safety. The movies provided opportunities to remember various points of personal safety, including the following:

- * Make sure a parent or trusted adult knows where you are going;
- * Do not take rides from others without checking with your folks;
- * Stay together when you are with your friends or on a class trip;
- * If a situation makes you feel uncomfortable or a warning “flag” goes up inside you, always talk it over with a parent or trusted adult.

These are simple reminders, but are of utmost importance in our effort to keep kids safe.

GOD'S FOOTPRINT

A French traveler was crossing the desert with a Bedouin guide. Several times a day, the Bedouin would kneel upon the sand and pray. The traveler wasn't a believer, and he became increasingly annoyed with the many stops they were making. One evening when the guide stopped for prayer, the traveler demanded, "*How do you know there is a God, anyway?*"

The guide stared calmly at the traveler. Softly he asked if he might first ask his own question. The traveler assented and the guide asked, "*This morning, when we awoke, how did you know it was a camel that passed by the tent during the night, and not a man?*" The traveler replied without hesitation – "*One had only to look at the print of the hoof in the sand – it was not the footprint of a man!*"

The guide then pointed to the western sky. Beyond a spring of clear water, and a grove of fig and date trees, the setting sun was throwing shafts of red and gold light into the sky. The desert sand became a shimmering canvas of brilliance. Pointing to the majesty of the scene, the guide said, "*Neither is that the footprint of a man...*"

Before creation, our sense of entitlement and self-importance diminishes. Caught up in awe, we come to recognize the *footprint of God* in our midst, and our hearts bow in humility. The challenge of reorienting our priorities is not just a problem faced in Biblical times – as in the story of the widow whose small contribution was pointed out by Jesus to have been the greatest of all. It is a message that we need to hear often, lest the quicksand of the consumer-culture swallow us up, and we forget the "footprint" that set the world in motion – the footprint of love that continues to sustain us.

Pope Francis has reminded us frequently that to live as authentic followers of Jesus we must live in the Spirit of Jesus – a spirit of humble servant-hood; a spirit that springs from a humble and grateful heart. One who lives from this orientation does not count the cost of discipleship; but delights in the joy of discipleship. Giving becomes an outreach of love, rather than a tax deduction! As we celebrate Veterans' Day, may we be mindful of those whose spirit of service has helped us to walk freely in a land of so many blessings. May our footsteps, too, bring love and mercy, joy and gratefulness to all of God's creation
