

## PASTORAL PLAN FOR REOPENING ST. JOAN OF ARC CHURCH

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass, issued by Bishop da Cunha, remains in effect until further notice. Those who are most vulnerable and at a greater risk due to age, preexisting health conditions, or in close proximity to vulnerable people are encouraged to remain home at this time. If you or a close loved one shows any symptoms of illness, please do not come to church.

**The weekend Mass schedule here at St. Joan of Arc Church will remain the same throughout the summer months... Saturday at 5:00pm, Sunday at 8:00am and 10:00am.** We have decided this primarily because adding another Mass on Sunday morning, as we normally do during the summer months, would not allow sufficient time to properly sanitize the church after each Mass. Mass intentions that have already been requested for 9:30am will be included with the 8:00am Mass for that day and the intentions requested for 11:00am will be remembered at the 10:00am Mass of that day unless otherwise requested. **During the week Mass is celebrated Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 8:00am.**

Per state regulations, gatherings cannot exceed 40% of a house of worship's occupancy capacity. Taking into account social distancing of 6 feet between people (or households), means only approximately 3 people in every other pew.

All worshippers will enter the church through the Main Entrance. For safety and order, a person will not be able to choose a specific seat. A specially trained group of greeters will be used to assist people to their seats. Once we reach our occupancy limit, we will not be able to admit others. Charity, cooperation and understanding are asked of all.

Everyone entering the church is required to wear a mask or other face covering. Please provide your own masks. While there is hand sanitizer available at the entrance, please consider providing your own, if you can, as supply is limited.

There will be receptacles at the entrance of the church in which you may place your contribution to the parish as you enter. You may place both 1st and 2nd collections together. On-line giving is encouraged via our parish website. Thank you so much for your support, especially at this extraordinary time.

The offertory procession (bringing up of the bread and wine) and the usual sign of peace will be eliminated. You may offer the sign of peace with a head nod and wave. The holy water fonts at the doors of the church will remain empty. Missals/hymnals have been removed as it would be difficult to sanitize them. Singing will be eliminated from our worship until further notice.

Holy Communion will be distributed at the usual time during the Mass. Those receiving Communion will approach row by row (keeping the 6 feet safe distancing protocol) and section by section. Please remain at your pew until your row is called. The priest will distribute Communion with sanitized hands while wearing a mask. Communicants may lift their mask just prior to receiving Holy Communion.

Following the Final Blessing, please immediately, reverently and quietly leave the church by the door closest to your pew maintaining the 6 feet distancing protocol. Upon exiting the church, please refrain from congregating near the doors of the church. After each Mass, the tops of the benches, door handles and other high traffic areas will be sanitized.

Scheduling for Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and Altar Servers will be suspended for the time being. All parish ministries and events will remain suspended until further notice. The church will be closed following each Mass. The Parish Office, Faith Formation Office and Thrift Shop will remain closed.

I encourage all who make the prudent judgement for themselves not to return to church for Mass, to instead participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and view other good quality spiritual programming on Catholic TV, found on your local cable Channel 268 or on EWTN, Channel 56. Mass is televised each Sunday at 11:00am on Channel 6. You can also view daily Mass on-line at <http://www.catholictv.org/masses/catholictv-mass>.

Let us remember one another in prayer especially those most in need of our prayers at this time. Let us commit ourselves to prayer for an end to the COVID-19 coronavirus.

## **KENYA COLLECTION THIS WEEK**

***God is good all the time! All the time, God is good!***

This phrase repeated multiple times at every Holy Cross Parish Mass conveys the love and hope we experienced in Dandora, Kenya.

With gratitude and full hearts Dennis and Barbara Smith, Jim Schermerhorn, and Anna Schantz from our Parish Youth Group returned from Holy Cross Parish in early October. We experienced the joy of exuberant celebrations of the Eucharist during an English and also during a Swahili Mass. We met with the St. Vincent de Paul ministry and helped distribute flour, salt and toilet paper to the needy. We visited St. James Pre-School (250 children) and Elementary School (450 students) and found curious and playful preschoolers and engaged elementary students. We met the five students our parish sponsors with scholarships, one of whom is the school student president! And we had the opportunity to spend a day at the Brother Andre Medical Center where our financial support enables early detection of cervical cancer, a leading cause of death among women in Kenya. Our support also enables women to be vaccinated for HIV. As a result the transmission of HIV from mothers to children is close to zero. We also saw two sets of twins recently born, thriving because of the professional medical delivery they received at the Brother Andre Medical Center. ## **HOUSE OF LIGHT**

A modern day “parable” points to the message of Jesus’ parables in today’s Gospel:

*A young boy lived with his family in a simple cottage overlooking a beautiful valley. One of his greatest joys on a summer evening was to look across the valley at a house, miles away – a house that seemed to burst into flame with windows that shone with a dazzling light in the glow of the setting sun. “What an incredible place that must be!” the boy thought, “And how happy the people lucky enough to live there.”*

*One day he packed a lunch and set out to find this magical house. It was much further than he had anticipated, and he arrived quite late in the evening. He was disappointed to find nothing but a simple cottage with ordinary windows. But the family that lived there kindly welcomed the little traveler and offered him hospitality for the night.*

*One of the children in the family – a girl about the same age as he – began telling him about a brilliant house of light across the valley that appeared every morning. She said she would wake him up at sunrise to see this extraordinary sight. So early the next morning just as the sun rose, the two children looked out across the valley. There on the opposite side sat a house set ablaze by the sun. With amazement, the boy recognized that this spectacular dwelling was his very own cottage!*

Jesus often uses parables to gently reveal layers of understanding that can only be seen from a different perspective – from a different viewpoint. He skillfully links the daily and familiar with the Divine Mystery that is beyond our knowing. It is our lived experiences that help us to crack open the door and see this Mystery at work in our daily lives.

In preaching the parables of the *buried treasure*, the *pearls*, and the *dragnet*, Jesus challenges us to see our lives and the world around us with eyes of trust and gratitude. Through these lenses our inner vision becomes 20/20. Through them we recognize things we may have missed—the blessings and good things that are ours already.

As we vacation, or go about our ordinary tasks during this challenging time, we are urged to look for the gifts that lie hidden therein. We ask for the grace to re-visit the treasures we hold dear: our families; friends; our community and our own well-being. With new appreciation we see the brilliant colors of God’s love, support, and forgiveness shining within us and all around us – May we have eyes to see the beauty and grace of God that is right in front of our very noses.
