

## PASTORAL PLAN FOR REOPENING ST. JOAN OF ARC CHURCH

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass, issued by Bishop da Cunha, remains in effect until further notice. Those who are most vulnerable and at a greater risk due to age, preexisting health conditions, or in close proximity to vulnerable people are encouraged to remain home at this time. If you or a close loved one shows any symptoms of illness, please do not come to church.

**The weekend Mass schedule here at St. Joan of Arc Church will remain the same throughout the summer months... Saturday at 5:00pm, Sunday at 8:00am and 10:00am.** We have decided this primarily because adding another Mass on Sunday morning, as we normally do during the summer months, would not allow sufficient time to properly sanitize the church after each Mass. Mass intentions that have already been requested for 9:30am will be included with the 8:00am Mass for that day and the intentions requested for 11:00am will be remembered at the 10:00am Mass of that day unless otherwise requested. **During the week Mass is celebrated Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 8:00am.**

Per state regulations, gatherings cannot exceed 40% of a house of worship's occupancy capacity. Taking into account social distancing of 6 feet between people (or households), means only approximately 3 people in every other pew.

All worshippers will enter the church through the Main Entrance. For safety and order, a person will not be able to choose a specific seat. A specially trained group of greeters will be used to assist people to their seats. Once we reach our occupancy limit, we will not be able to admit others. Charity, cooperation and understanding are asked of all.

Everyone entering the church is required to wear a mask or other face covering. Please provide your own masks. While there is hand sanitizer available at the entrance, please consider providing your own, if you can, as supply is limited.

There will be receptacles at the entrance of the church in which you may place your contribution to the parish as you enter. You may place both 1st and 2nd collections together. On-line giving is encouraged via our parish website. Thank you so much for your support, especially at this extraordinary time.

The offertory procession (bringing up of the bread and wine) and the usual sign of peace will be eliminated. You may offer the sign of peace with a head nod and wave. The holy water fonts at the doors of the church will remain empty. Missals/hymnals have been removed as it would be difficult to sanitize them. Singing will be eliminated from our worship until further notice.

Holy Communion will be distributed at the usual time during the Mass. Those receiving Communion will approach row by row (keeping the 6 feet safe distancing protocol) and section by section. Please remain at your pew until your row is called. The priest will distribute Communion with sanitized hands while wearing a mask. Communicants may lift their mask just prior to receiving Holy Communion.

Following the Final Blessing, please immediately, reverently and quietly leave the church by the door closest to your pew maintaining the 6 feet distancing protocol. Upon exiting the church, please refrain from congregating near the doors of the church. After each Mass, the tops of the benches, door handles and other high traffic areas will be sanitized.

Scheduling for Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and Altar Servers will be suspended for the time being. All parish ministries and events will remain suspended until further notice. The church will be closed following each Mass. The Parish Office, Faith Formation Office and Thrift Shop will remain closed.

I encourage all who make the prudent judgement for themselves not to return to church for Mass, to instead participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and view other good quality spiritual programming on Catholic TV, found on your local cable Channel 268 or on EWTN, Channel 56. Mass is televised each Sunday at 11:00am on Channel 6. You can also view daily Mass on-line at <http://www.catholictv.org/masses/catholictv-mass>.

Let us remember one another in prayer especially those most in need of our prayers at this time. Let us commit ourselves to prayer for an end to the COVID-19 coronavirus.

## Weekly Reflection by Judy Burt Walker, Director of Faith Formation

### MORE THAN ENOUGH

*Stone Soup* is a simple children's story that speaks to the heart of the Gospel message:

*A stranger arrived in town and he was hungry. But there was a famine in the land and the people were cautious. They were hoarding their small stashes of food for fear that they would not have enough. (Does this remind you of the recent toilet paper shortage?). They were reluctant to share what little they had with one another – let alone, a stranger!*

*So the stranger built a fire in the town square and started a pot to boiling, into which he put a stone. Then he suggested that his stone soup would taste better with a carrot or a potato or a few beans, and so on. Cautiously, the folks begin to bring their small bits to add to the pot and soon there was a hearty soup – and more than enough for all!*

In the Gospel we see Jesus feeding the multitude with five loaves and a couple of fish – certainly a miraculous event! But we might also imagine – and perhaps even more miraculously – that Jesus' magnanimous act of generosity inspired the crowd to do the same – to share whatever small bits of food they had brought along for themselves. This act of contributing to the whole *miraculously* formed the multitude into community. We might imagine them sitting side-by-side with strangers as they broke bread and shared it with those around them – *and there was more than enough to satisfy everyone's hunger.*

In our world there are people who have no food even while – in some countries – obesity is fast becoming the #1 cause of death. There are people without access to the simplest medical care while others have access to the best there is to offer. Why the disparity? Is it only in times of crisis like a pandemic that we grasp what it means to share what little we feel we might have to offer – to become community in the true sense of the word? Has a sense of scarcity and fear given rise to a foreboding about our own security?

Teresa of Avila reminds us that: "*Christ has no body now on earth but yours, no hands but yours, no feet but yours. Yours are the eyes through which Christ's compassion is to look out to the earth; yours are the feet by which He is to go about doing good; and yours are the hands by which He is to bless us now.*"

Whatever happened on that hillside long ago still holds the same lessons for us: We are called to bring our gifts "*to the pot*" – to follow Jesus' example – to care and contribute to the good of the whole. May we not hesitate to open our hearts – to share ourselves, our time and our talents that we all might live fully as one community – Christ's Body here on this earth.
