PASTORAL PLAN FOR REOPENING ST. JOAN OF ARC CHURCH

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass, issued by Bishop da Cunha, remains in effect until further notice. Those who are most vulnerable and at a greater risk due to age, preexisting health conditions, or in close proximity to vulnerable people are encouraged to remain home at this time. If you or a close loved one shows any symptoms of illness, please do not come to church.

The weekend Mass schedule here at St. Joan of Arc Church will remain the same throughout the summer months... Saturday at 5:00pm, Sunday at 8:00am and 10:00am. We have decided this primarily because adding another Mass on Sunday morning, as we normally do during the summer months, would not allow sufficient time to properly sanitize the church after each Mass. Mass intentions that have already been requested for 9:30am will be included with the 8:00am Mass for that day and the intentions requested for 11:00am will be remembered at the 10:00am Mass of that day unless otherwise requested. **During the week Mass is celebrated Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 8:00am.**

Per state regulations, gatherings cannot exceed 40% of a house of worship's occupancy capacity. Taking into account social distancing of 6 feet between people (or households), means only approximately 3 people in every other pew.

All worshippers will enter the church through the Main Entrance. For safety and order, a person will not be able to choose a specific seat. A specially trained group of greeters will be used to assist people to their seats. Once we reach our occupancy limit, we will not be able to admit others. Charity, cooperation and understanding are asked of all.

Everyone entering the church is required to wear a mask or other face covering. Please provide your own masks. While there is hand sanitizer available at the entrance, please consider providing your own, if you can, as supply is limited.

There will be receptacles at the entrance of the church in which you may place your contribution to the parish as you enter. You may place both 1st and 2nd collections together. On-line giving is encouraged via our parish website. Thank you so much for your support, especially at this extraordinary time.

The offertory procession (bringing up of the bread and wine) and the usual sign of peace will be eliminated. You may offer the sign of peace with a head nod and wave. The holy water fonts at the doors of the church will remain empty. Missals/hymnals have been removed as it would be difficult to sanitize them. Singing will be eliminated from our worship until further notice.

Holy Communion will be distributed at the usual time during the Mass. Those receiving Communion will approach row by row (keeping the 6 feet safe distancing protocol) and section by section. Please remain at your pew until your row is called. The priest will distribute Communion with sanitized hands while wearing a mask. Communicants may lift their mask just prior to receiving Holy Communion.

Following the Final Blessing, please immediately, reverently and quietly leave the church by the door closest to your pew maintaining the 6 feet distancing protocol. Upon exiting the church, please refrain from congregating near the doors of the church. After each Mass, the tops of the benches, door handles and other high traffic areas will be sanitized.

Scheduling for Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and Altar Servers will be suspended for the time being. All parish ministries and events will remain suspended until further notice. The church will be closed following each Mass. The Parish Office, Faith Formation Office and Thrift Shop will remain closed.

I encourage all who make the prudent judgment for themselves not to return to church for Mass, to instead participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and view other good quality spiritual programming on Catholic TV, found on your local cable Channel 268 or on EWTN, Channel 56. Mass is televised each Sunday at 11:00am on Channel 6. You can also view daily Mass on-line at <http://www.catholictv.org/masses/catholictv-mass>.

Let us remember one another in prayer especially those most in need of our prayers at this time. Let us commit ourselves to prayer for an end to the COVID-19 coronavirus.

Wellfleet Apartments, developed and operated by the Community Development, is a 12-unit rental community consisting of one, two and three bedroom apartments designed for family households. Wellfleet Apartments has no vacancies at this time, but a waiting list has been established for all units. Applications are accepted on a first come, first serve basis. Wellfleet Apartments are subsidized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Housing Service, Barnstable County HOME Fund and MA Department of Housing and Community Development Home Funds. Residents pay a designated percentage of their income for rent. The first priority for occupancy is provided to eligible household applicants whose family income is 50% or less of the established median family income of the area. Weekly Reflection by Judy Burt Walker, Director of Faith Formation

HOME

Megan McKenna, author of *Parables: The Arrows of God*, recounts the tale of a blacksmith who was revered in his village for his hard work, skill, and generosity. The day came for him to die and an angel was sent to accompany his soul on its journey to heaven. But the man asked that the angel let him stay awhile longer because his neighbors needed him to help with the planting. The angel agreed.

A few months later, the angel returned to bring the humble blacksmith to his place in heaven. The blacksmith said that he didn't mean to seem ungrateful, but he would really like to stay awhile longer. It was now the time of harvest and his neighbors needed assistance – particularly one very ill neighbor whose family would be destitute without the crops. Again the angel agreed.

After many years, the blacksmith grew old and weary. He realized that it was time, and so he told God, that should the angel come again, he was ready to go.

When God's angel appeared to the blacksmith, the blacksmith greeted the angel eagerly. He told the angel that he was now ready to go home to God's kingdom.

The angel laughed and, with delight and surprise, asked "*Where do you think you've been all these years?*" The blacksmith was already home!

Throughout the Gospel, Jesus challenges our often-misplaced values – our distorted relationships with money, food; technology; power; image – at the expense of the important relationships we have with family, friends, community, – and God. The disciples who walked with Jesus throughout Galilee, and the disciples who continue to walk with him today, are called to *detach* from the ephemeral and the shallow in order to *attach* to the lasting, fulfilling things of God.

The blacksmith had already discovered the true blessings of life that enabled him to find "*God's home*" in his present life. He was attentive and generous in cultivating his relationship with his neighbors – willing to assist them in whatever way he could. We, too, by embracing the spirit of God's compassion and mercy in our ordinary lives, can transform our time and place into the time and place of God. It is truly in giving of ourselves that we find and receive the fullness of Life.
